Dick Brogan Lecture Series Protestant Spirituality Dr. Loyd Allen October 6-7

Dr. Loyd Allen, professor of church history and spiritual formation at McAfee School of Theology at Mercer University in Atlanta , is our 2018 Dick Brogan Lecture Series scholar. He will present two lectures on Saturday evening, a third lecture on Sunday morning during Adult Sunday School, and a dramatic monologue of Martin Luther during morning worship .

Dr. Allen has taught in higher education for over thirty years and is the author of numerous publications, including the books *You are a Great People* and *Crossroads in Christian Growth*. He has a particular interest in Christian spirituality, which he teaches at McAfee and as faculty for the Academy of Spiritual Formation, and he frequently leads retreats and pilgrimages abroad.

Loyd, his wife Libby, and daughter Clare were members of Northside when Loyd was chair of the Christian Studies and Philosophy Department at Mississippi College, 1992-1995. Libby will join Loyd for the weekend with us.

In preparation for the lectures Dr. Allen suggest reading the book, *Protestant Spiritual Exercises* by Joseph D. Driskell.

Football Ministry Begins

As the Clinton Arrow football team walks off the practice field, you will see young men of all sizes, shapes, colors, socio-economic backgrounds and sometimes religions. They play football together because they love the game, but they also play it for another reason: to represent themselves, their school and their community in the best way possible.

Since 2010, every Tuesday evening following those practices, the Northside Youth Building is open to those members of the team that wish to be a part of what has become known as the "Football Ministry". What began as an open door invitation and started with a small gathering of 15-20 players has now expanded to averaging 42 players each week. What began as chips, cookies and sugary soft drinks has now evolved into a meal of some sort whether it is hot dogs, red beans and rice or lasagna and all served with Gatorade.

The players that are involved with the Football Ministry are provided with a safe environment, good food, and an event that is held at a church with prayer and words of encouragement. It also provides for good fellowship with their teammates away from the football field and away from distractions that may sometimes mean trouble.
